

Windows 10 Professional – Domain Logon



Before joining Windows 10 Professional to the domain you must first run the registry script “joindomain.reg”. This registry script can be found in the “\\server\netlogon_v2\registry\computer” folder.

Windows 10 also has additional security policies in place when accessing UNC shares. By default, Windows 10 will display “Access is denied” when you browse the “netlogon” share. To fix this problem you need to update a group policy setting in Windows 10.

Step 1:

Run `gpedit.msc`

Computer -> Administrative Templates -> Network - Network Provider -> Hardened UNC Paths




Enable the policy, click the [Show] button and enter “*\netlogon” into the “Value name” field and “RequireMutualAuthentication=0,RequireIntegrity=0,RequirePrivacy=0” into the “Value” field.


Click OK twice and close the group policy editor.

Step 2:

Right-click on the Start Menu and choose System. Click “Change settings” under the “Computer name, domain, and workgroup settings” section, then click the “Change...” button from the System Properties window that appears.



Select the “Domain” option from the Computer Name/Domain Changes window, enter the domain name of your Smart-Net server (e.g. WORKGROUP), then click OK.



When prompted, enter your credentials for either the “administrator” or “sysadmin” accounts, then click OK.



Restart the computer.
